Preparation and material needed	 Print as many SciDiplo bingo cards as attendees One symbolic prize for the person able to call up "SciDiplo bingo!"
Recommended use case and guidance for the trainer	Attendees will be handed a 4x4 or 5x5 table with sentences on it that require completing them with an attendee name that fulfils the sentence, for instance: "I have worked in three continents" "I work or have worked at an embassy as the science responsible officer" "I have three children", etc. This is a game to be done during the whole conference/workshop, but it can also be limited to an evening or social reception time When one attendee has been able to fill up all spaces because she has identified all the people fulfilling the different criteria, she can call up "SciDiplo Bingo!" and will be the winner of this exercise
